

Connection to Robert the Bruce of Scotland through de Burgh

Richard og de Burgh, 2nd Earl of Ulster, 3rd Baron of Connaught (“og” meaning “young”) b. 1259 at Ulster, Ireland d. 29 July 1326 at Tipperary, County Tipperary, Ireland. He was buried after 29 August 1326 at Athassel Priory, Golden, County Tipperary, Ireland. Richard married his cousin's daughter, Margaret de Burgh before 27 February 1281 in Ireland. Richard, called *The Red Earl*, “was one of the most powerful Irish nobles of the late 13th and early 14th centuries.” He was a good friend of Edward I and, therefore, a foe to his own son-in-law, Robert the Bruce of Scotland.

Lord Thomas de Multon, 1st Baron Multon of Egremont b. 21 February 1276 at Cumberland, England d. before 8 February 1322 at Boroughbridge, Yorkshire, England. He married **Eleanor de Burgh** at St. Peter's Priory, in the King's presence, on 3 January 1297 at Ipswich, Suffolk, England. Lady Eleanor was born about 1282 in Ireland and died after 22 August 1323 Moulton, Lincolnshire, England. She was the daughter of Richard og de Burgh and Margaret de Burgh, the daughter of his [Richard's] cousin, John.

Lady Elizabeth de Multon b. ? at Aldingham, Lancashire, England d. before 1334 in Ireland. He was knighted before 1331. He married Elizabeth de Multon/Moulton, daughter of Thomas de Multon and one of the three sisters and co-heiresses of John de Multon, ca. 1327. Elizabeth was the “heirress of several estates including Thurston in Suffolk; Moulton, Skirbeck and Fleet in Lincolnshire, of Egremont in Cumbria and of manors in County Limerick, Ireland.” She was born ca. 1306 and died 1344 at Aldingham, Lancashire, England. After Sir Robert's death, Elizabeth married Walter de Birmingham on 23 November 1334.

He married Joan de Birmingham, daughter of his step-father, Walter de Birmingham.¹ Joan was born 1335 at Ulverston, Lancashire, England and died 1359 at Ulverston, Lancashire, England.

Aldingham, Lancashire, England. He married (1) Alice de Greystoke ca. 1376. They had no children. He married (2) Lady Isabel Loring ca. 1383 at Bedfordshire, England. Isabel was born 1354 Chalgrave, Bedfordshire, England, the daughter and co-heiress of Sir Nele Loring, KG, one of the founding Knights of the Garter. She was the widow of Sir William Cogan who d.1382. Lady Isabel died 21 August 1400 Aldingham, Lancashire, England. They had one child. Robert's father died when he was seven and he became a ward of King Edward III. In 1377, Robert was knighted during the Coronation of King Richard II.

Sir William Harington, 5th Baron Harington b. about 1392 at Gleason Hall, Aldingham, Lancashire, England d. 3 March 1457 at Aldingham, Lancashire, England, United Kingdom. He was buried 1457 at Great Urswick, Lancashire, England. His Will was probated on 21 May 1457. William married Margaret Hill, daughter of Sir John Hill, Recorder of Exeter, Justice of the King's Bench and Maud Daubeney, circa 1423. Margaret was born 1384 at Somerset, England, United Kingdom. She died 5 March 1457, apparently the same year as her husband. They had one child, a daughter, Elizabeth. With no male issue to carry on the Harington Barony, the title fell to Elizabeth's husband, William Bonville.

William Bonville, 6th Baron Harington b. April 1442 at Chewton, Somerset, England d. 31 December 1460 at Wakefield, Metropolitan Borough of Wakefield, West Yorkshire, England. William married Katherine de Neville ca. 1459. Katherine was born in 1442 at Salisbury, Wiltshire, England to Richard de Neville and Alice Montagu. Katherine died before 25 March 1504 at Ashby de la Zouch, Leicestershire, England. She was previously married to William Hastings and had one daughter, Anne. William perished at the Battle of Wakefield on 31 December 1460 at Wakefield, Yorkshire, England. He died without male issue. He was buried 11 January 1461 at Wakefield, West Yorkshire, England, United Kingdom.

Baroness Cecily Bonville, 7th Baroness of Harington b. 30 June 1460 at Shute, Devon, England d. 12 May 1529 at Shacklewell, Middlesex, England. She was buried at St. Mary The Virgin Churchyard, Woodnesborough, Kent, England, United Kingdom. She married **Sir Thomas Grey, 1st Marquess of Dorset** and eldest son of Elizabeth Woodville, Queen Consort to King Edward IV 18 July 1474. His 1st marriage was to Anne Holland until she died and without issue. Sir Thomas was born 22 June 1455 at Groby, Leicestershire, England and died 20 September 1501 at London, Middlesex, England; Buried in Astley, Warwick, England. He was buried alongside his wife in 1501 at Saint Mary The Virgin Churchyard, Astley, Warwickshire, England. Prior to Henry VII and his Lancastrian army leaving to launch what turned to be their successful invasion of England in August 1485, Sir Thomas heard rumours from England that *"his mother had come to terms with Richard III, and he was persuaded to desert Henry Tudor. He was intercepted at Compiègne on his way to England, and played no part in the invasion or subsequent overthrow of Richard III. Grey was instead confined to Paris, as security for the repayment of a loan made to Henry Tudor by the French government, unable to return home until Henry VII was safely installed as king of England."*

He is mentioned in the will of his brother, Sir John Grey. He served as Lord Lieutenant of Ireland.

8. Cecily Grey died 28 April 1554. She married John Sutton, 3rd Baron Dudley.
9. Bridget Grey, believed to have died young.
10. Dorothy Grey b. 1480 d. 1552. She married (1) Robert Willoughby, 2nd Baron Willoughby de Broke, by whom she had issue, and (2) William Blount, 4th Baron Mountjoy.

12. Margaret Grey married Richard Wake, esquire. She is referred to as 'Margaret Grey' in the will of her brother, Sir John Grey.

Sir Thomas II de Grey b. 22 June 1477 at Bashall Eaves, Yorkshire, England d. 10 October 1530 at Bashall Eaves, Yorkshire, England. He is buried at St. Mary the Virgin Churchyard in Astley, Warwickshire. On 20 April 1501, he became the 8th Baron Ferrers

of Groby [E., 1299] In 1508 he was sent to the Tower of London, and later a gaol in Calais, under suspicion of conspiracy against Henry VII.² Although he was saved from execution in 1509 by the accession of King Henry VIII, Grey was attainted and lost his titles.³ However, later he was pardoned and returned to court, and was summoned to parliament as Baron Ferrers of Groby. In 1511, he was summoned as Marquess of Dorset.⁴ Thomas Grey was contracted in 1483 to marry Anne St Leger (1476–1526), the daughter of Anne of York, Duchess of Exeter and her second husband Sir Thomas St Leger. Remarkably, Anne St Leger had been declared the heiress to the Exeter estates, but the marriage did not take place.⁵ Sir Thomas married (1) Eleanor St. John and (2) Lady Margaretha Wotton, daughter of Sir Robert Wotton. She was born 1485 at Boughton Malherbe, Kent, England d. 6 October 1535 at Bashall Eaves, Yorkshire, England, United Kingdom. Sir Thomas and Lady Margaretha/Margaret were married in 1500 at Groby Castle, Leicestershire, England. Lady Margaretha was Godmother to Princess Elizabeth, daughter of Henry VIII and Ann Boleyn. Her eventual granddaughter, Lady Jane Grey, was the designated successor of King Edward VI, by his will, and for nine days in July 1553 briefly sat on the throne of England.

England, United Kingdom and d. 4 February 1617. Her parents were Sir Anthony Browne and his 1st wife, Alice Gage.

Frances Mary Greville was born ca 1598 in Essex, England. She was married three times, the last being Samuel Matthews Sr. She immigrated to Jamestown, Virginia in 1620 possibly with her first husband. She married Samuel ca. 1629.

Samuel Matthews was born ca 1600 “probably in England. He came to Virginia before 1618 as a servant to Sheriff Johnson of London. He was first in James Towne but went to live in Sherley hundred.

Samuel was first married to **Frances Greville** after 24 Mar 1627. Frances was born in England and came to Virginia in the Supply when she was less than 20 years old in 1620. She was first married to Nathaniel West by whom she had a son named Nathaniel and later to Abraham Piersey.”

Reuben Holloway b. 1740 in Virginia and d. 6 October 1806 in Edgefield, South Carolina. He married **Peninah Jordan** b. 1750 at Perquimans, North Carolina, British Colonial America, d. 1820.⁶ Reuben is buried in the Holloway Family Cemetery in Ninety-Six, Greenwood County, SC. He was a Revolutionary War soldier.⁷ Both Reuben and Peninah had been married twice. Peninah appears to have married Shadrack Stanley after Reuben's death in 1806, judging by the birthdates of the Holloway children. A J.W. Stanley Bible entry shows that Shadrack Stanley had married “unknown

Moon” or “Moor” after 1820 in Alabama. Since Peninah died in 1820, it would appear that Shadrack remarried after that date, as indicated. The name of the father of Peninah's children is questioned by the Stanley family. (source: <https://larry30252.tripod.com/stanleyfamilytree/id4.html>) It appears as though they are also not certain of Shadrack's marriage to Peninah. The following list of children, males only, are named in the Bond Agreement between Peninah Holloway and Jesse Holloway, a nephew of Reuben, (who is most likely the husband of Catherine Jordan, not Reuben) There is a record, or citation, from Ken Crouse with the Crouse family website which shows that the mother of Keziah Holloway Mitchell was Peninah Jordan. However, that website is no longer up.
